



## From our Rector

On my desk at Trinity is, among (way too many) other things, a day-by-day Downton Abbey calendar, a gift from a dear friend and fellow DA enthusiast (and actually the person from whose lips I first heard the words "Downton Abbey"). The pages of the calendar alternate between featuring cultural and historical tidbits about Britain in the early 20<sup>th</sup> century, and photographs of the various characters from the show's many seasons captioned with appropriate bits of dialogue from the scripts.

The Saturday/Sunday page from this last weekend is a photograph of Dame Maggie Smith as Violet, the Dowager Countess of Grantham seated on a chair, looking up at someone standing out of camera range. The look on her face manages to convey both innocence and smug self-satisfaction at the same time (as only Maggie Smith can do), and the caption reads, "At my age, one must ration one's excitement."


S.A.S. PROGRAMS

## BOOK CLUB



The Book Club will be meeting on **Saturday June 13th** in the Library from 9:30am—11:00am. This month the group will review their current selection: The Absolutely True Diary of a Part-Time Indian by Sherman Alexie. Come join them for a truly enjoyable morning, and some lively literary discussions. A synopsis follows:

Arnold (known as Junior) Spirit is an aspiring cartoonist (samples of his work can be found throughout the book) who has a plethora of problems: he has medical issues ranging from poor eyesight and a past onset of seizures, one friend, and a troubled yet loving family. His world gets overturned when a teacher tells him to get off the reservation, not figuratively, but psychologically and spiritually. Junior's never had someone encourage him in his full potential to be something other than "another troubled drunken Indian," so when the chance comes to transfer to a good school in the middle of a racist town outside his home, Junior leaps at the chance.

While there, Junior struggles with the mere fact that he's a Native American in a sea of white students and teachers; this fact continues to plague him when his friend turns his back on him and his whole reservation thinks he's a sell-out. But Junior, Lord bless him, is determined to make a name for himself, and even finds a little romance, convoluted as it is, and makes a few friends who help him expand his mind and reach his goals.

Narrated like random passages from a journal (hence the title), Junior is a funny, sweet, and conflicted boy. He is a wonderful voice for a life that no one notices. Junior brings all the suffering and issues of Native Americans around the US and makes them real while pouring out his heart about his troubles adjusting to two worlds. He will have you laughing out loud and wiping tears all at the same time.

This is renowned author Sherman Alexie's first novel for teens! He has such a crisp voice, it's hard not to be pulled into his narrator's world. You'll cheer for Junior throughout the novel.


