From our Rector

As we mentioned at last January's Annual Meeting, the delegates to this December's Diocesan Convention (Dec. 2-3) will be electing a Bishop Coadjutor who will succeed Bishop Bruno as Bishop Diocesan upon Bp. Bruno's retirement in, or by, 2018.

Article XX.44 of our diocesan canons states, "The election shall be made in the following manner: The clergy and the laity shall vote by orders [i.e. separately from each other], and the election shall be by ballot. If two-thirds of all the clergy entitled to vote be registered as present, and two-thirds of all the Parishes and Missions entitled to vote be registered as represented, then a majority of the votes in each order present shall determine a choice. If such two-thirds of the clergy, Parishes and Missions be not registered as present, two-thirds of the votes of each order present shall be necessary to determine a choice."

Any candidates for election as a Bishop (Diocesan, Coadjutor, or Suffragan) must be a priest at least 30 years old and, once elected, must receive the consents of a majority of the Standing Committees of all Dioceses as well as the consents of a majority of all Bishops "currently exercising jurisdiction" before being consecrated. (That is, the consents of retired Bishops or Bishops serving in non-diocesan positions or ministries are not required.)

The Diocesan Search Committee has released a slate of five candidates, but before I say anything about them, I want to list the gatherings that have been scheduled so that all interested members of the Diocese can meet and hear from the candidates. (Attendance at these gatherings is not limited to clergy and upcoming delegates, but is strongly recommended for both these groups.)

The first "meet and greet", while not scheduled at the greatest time traffic-wise, is still the closest one for us: Friday, Oct. 7, from 6 p.m. - 9 p.m., the candidates will be at St. George's Episcopal Church in Laguna Hills. The format for all the sites will be the same – a plenary session with all the candidates, followed by break-out sessions with each individual candidate.

I'm going to put a sign-up sheet on the back bulletin board. If anyone is interested in carpooling to the Laguna Hills event, please sign up and we'll organize a caravan down the river of molasses known as the 5 Freeway on a Friday afternoon!

The other gatherings are as follows: Saturday, Oct. 8, 10 a.m. – 1 p.m. at Campbell Hall School in North Hollywood. **This meeting will also offer a webcast of the plenary session only, available on the diocesan website at ladiocese.org.** Saturday, Oct. 8, 3 p.m. – 6 p.m. at St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Ventura, and Sunday, Oct. 9, 1 p.m. – 4 p.m., Trinity Episcopal Church, Redlands.

In alphabetical order, the candidates are:

The Rev. Paul Fromberg, 55, Rector of St. Gregory of Nyssa Episcopal Church in San Francisco. Ordained a priest in 1991, Rev. Fromberg has served parishes in Texas and the Bay Area and brings outreach, cathedral, youth, and liturgical specializations.

The Rev. Rachel Nyback, 46, Rector of St. Cross-by-the-Sea in Hermosa Beach (and sometime "Safeguarding God's Children" facilitator here at Trinity). Ordained a priest in 2005, Rev. Nyback has served parishes in Washington D.C. and southern California after a career as a teacher in Kuwait.

The Rev. Anna Olson, 45, Rector of St. Mary's Episcopal Church (Mariposa Ave.), Los Angeles. Ordained a priest in 2001, Rev. Olson's ministry has been in southern California and includes time as the LA Director of the non-profit "Clergy and Laity United for Economic Justice".


The Rt. Rev. Pierre Whalon, 63, currently Bishop for the Paris-based Convocation of Episcopal Churches in Europe. Ordained a priest in 1985 and consecrated bishop in 2001, Bp. Whalon has also served parishes in Pennsylvania and Florida. He brings experience in international, interfaith, and financial initiatives.

The Rev. Mauricio Wilson, 50, Rector of St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Oakland, California. A native of Costa Rica, Rev. Wilson was ordained a priest in 2002 and has served parishes in Costa Rica, New York, and the Bay Area following his career as a banker-auditor, initially with Coopers & Lybrand.

According to the diocesan website, "Detailed information and candidates' replies to questions submitted by the search committee will be published in upcoming editions of the Episcopal News and posted to the diocesan website."

There is also a procedure in place for the nomination of additional candidates by petition. Should any names be added to the slate via that route, we'll let you know.

Whoever is elected will shape our diocesan culture for years to come, so stay on top of developments by staying in touch with our delegates: Rocky Covill, Jonnae Ostrom, Mary Robinson, Charles Stevenson, and alternate Hal Parmenter. And remember, if you want to carpool to the "meet and greet" in Laguna Hills on Oct. 7, sign up on the back bulletin board!

OCTOBER BOOK STUDY

For this month's study, on **Saturday October 8th** the group will discuss the book Negroland by Margo Jefferson. They meet in the library from 9:30am - 11:00am. Come join them for a truly enjoyable morning, and some lively literary discussions. *A synopsis follows:*

Winner of the National Book Critics Circle Award

One of the Best Books of the Year: *The Washington Post, Los Angeles Times, Time, Vanity Fair, Marie Claire, Time Out New York, Minneapolis Star Tribune, Kansas City Star, Men's Journal, Oprah.com*

Pulitzer Prize-winning cultural critic Margo Jefferson was born in 1947 into upper-crust black Chicago. Her father was head of pediatrics at Provident Hospital, while her mother was a socialite. In these pages, Jefferson takes us into this insular and discerning society: "I call it Negroland," she writes, "because I still find 'Negro' a word of wonders, glorious and terrible."

Negroland's pedigree dates back generations, having originated with antebellum free blacks who made their fortunes among the plantations of the South. It evolved into a world of exclusive sororities, fraternities, networks, and clubs—a world in which skin color and hair texture were relentlessly evaluated alongside scholarly and professional achievements, where the Talented Tenth positioned themselves as a third race between whites and "the masses of Negroes," and where the motto was "Achievement. Invulnerability. Comportment." At once incendiary and icy, mischievous and provocative, celebratory and elegiac, Negroland is a landmark work on privilege, discrimination, and the fallacy of post-racial America.






Shepherd of the Hills
