## From our Rector

Now that the election of the Rev. Canon John H. Taylor as Bishop-Coadjutor of the Diocese of Los Angeles has received the consent of a majority of the Bishops with jurisdiction as well as a majority of the Diocesan Standing Committees of the Episcopal Church, it's full speed ahead for his consecration on July 8!

This being said, I'd like to tell you about several opportunities we have in the next few months to gather with Bishop-elect Taylor.

First, coming up in just a few weeks, Bishop-elect Taylor will be joining us for the Annual Deanery IX BBQ, being hosted once again by chef Martin Greenridge, Fr. Russell Touchstone, and the people of St. Francis Episcopal Church in Norwalk. Taking place from 11 a.m. – 3 p.m. on Saturday, May 20, the BBQ will feature not only chef Martin's mouthwatering offerings from the grill, but also raffles, games, and a silent auction with the proceeds going to benefit the ministries of Deanery IX.

(St. Francis hosted the BBQ last June as well with chef Martin at the grill, but unfortunately Fr. Touchstone wasn't able to attend as he was being honored at the Cathedral Center for 50 years of ordained ministry at exactly the same time! He's delighted to offer us a "redo" that he can enjoy as well.)

According to the people of St. Francis, this is an open invitation and we're all welcome to bring friends. What a great idea! St. Francis is located at 12700 Paddison Avenue in Norwalk – and if you're interested in seeing what Mr. Greenridge is likely to be serving, you can see photos from last year's BBQ, including shots of the grill, on the St. Francis Facebook page.

Our next opportunity is Bishop-elect Taylor's consecration as Bishop Coadjutor. The service will be held at 1:30 p.m. at the Dorothy Chandler Pavilion of the Music Center of Los Angeles County on Saturday, July 8.

Because space is limited (3,100 seats maximum), tickets are being distributed among the diocese's 135 active congregations in 20-ticket blocks on a first come, first served basis. All seats are reserved, but **all tickets are free**. To have a ticket reserved for you, please sign up on the sheet that Amy has posted on the back bulletin board. Before we can receive our block of tickets, we must submit the names, email addresses, and phone numbers of the Trinity folks who will be sitting in the seats, and the deadline for Amy to submit this information is **prior to noon on May 15**.

According to the diocesan invitation, "A warm welcome is extended to all for a festive, culturally diverse celebration designed to be a hospitable, accessible, and meaningful gathering for all in attendance. Because no Southland Episcopal church building is large enough to accommodate the anticipated congregation, the Dorothy Chandler Pavilion has been selected as a centrally located, gracious, functional and affordable public venue.

"Video of the full service will be offered via live webcast and on demand.

"A 100-voice choir will assemble under the direction of Sean O'Neal, director of music at Holy Trinity Church, Covina. Participation details will be forwarded to music directors in the congregations of the diocese. Liturgical arrangements are under the direction of the Rev. Fernando Valdes, deacon, of St. John's ProCathedral as minister of ceremonies.

"Festive displays of banners of the congregations, schools, institutions and other ministries of the Diocese of Los Angeles are planned; information will follow in communication with staff of local congregations.

"A variety of international foods will be made available in Grand Park [across the street from the Music Center], with a blend of complementary selections and options for purchase from local vendors.

"Ample parking in the Music Center garages will be available for \$9 per vehicle."

If you are interested in having a ticket reserved for you, PLEASE SIGN UP ASAP on the back bulletin board. Once we see who all would like to attend, we will set up carpools.

Finally and most personally, the duly-consecrated Bishop Coadjutor Taylor will be here at Trinity to administer the sacrament of Confirmation at the 10 a.m. service on Sunday, Nov. 5, **ALL SAINTS' SUNDAY!!! YAAAY!!!**

(CnC families, take note – this is the Confirmation date for the current class.)

(Anglican snippet: if Bishop John baptizes an adult during his visit to Trinity, it would be a double sacrament – both Baptism and Confirmation – because Confirmation is "a mature public affirmation of faith" and within the context of the baptismal service the adult individual would be making those affirmations that Confirmation simply reaffirms.)

In anticipation of Bishop Taylor's visit, our next Adult Inquirers' Class will take place on seven consecutive Sunday afternoons in the parish library: from 4 p.m. – 5:30 p.m., Sept. 17 through Oct. 29.

As I mentioned in last September's Trinity Talk, long before we knew when we'd be receiving our next visit from a Bishop, the Adult Inquirers' Class is for anyone new to the Episcopal Church, anyone who would like to learn more about the greater Church, anyone who would like to explore their faith in the company of other adults, anyone interested in being confirmed or received into the Episcopal Church, anyone who would like to reaffirm their baptismal vows in the presence of a Bishop, and anyone who's just interested in hanging out with other Trinity adults on a Sunday afternoon! **BOOK CLUB**

The Book Club will be meeting on **Saturday May 13th** in the Library from 9:30am—11:00am. This month the group will review their current selection: Still Life (A Chief Inspector Gamache Novel #1) by Louise Penny. Come join them for a truly enjoyable morning, and some lively literary discussions. A synopsis follows:

Penny's terrific first novel, which was the runner-up for the CWA's Debut Dagger Award in 2004, introduces Armand Gamache of the Sûreté du Québec. When the body of Jane Neal, is found near a woodland trail used by deer hunters outside the village of Three Pines, it appears she's the victim of a hunting accident. Miss Neal, the village's retired school-teacher and a talented amateur artist, has been a good friend to most of the townsfolk, so her loss is keenly felt.

But some folks are suspicious, and Chief Inspector Armand Gamache of the Montreal Sûreté is called in to investigate. Accompanying Gamache are his loyal assistant Beauvoir and Yvette Nichol, a new addition to Gamache's team. They soon determine that the woman was most likely murdered. The trio finds that the seemingly peaceful, friendly village hides dark secrets. The truth is both bizarre and shocking, even to the experienced Gamache and his team.

Like a virtuoso, Penny plays a complex variation on the theme of the clue hidden in plain sight. She deftly uses the bilingual, bicultural aspect of Quebecois life as well as arcane aspects of archery and art to deepen her narrative. Memorable characters include Jane; Jane's shallow niece, Yolande; and a delightful gay couple, Olivier and Gabri. Filled with unexpected insights, this winning traditional mystery sets a solid foundation for future entries in the series.


