## From our Rector

This article is a modified reprint of my June *Trinity Talk* article from a year ago. As Amy and I looked it over, running it again seemed like a pretty good idea. After all, I've only JUST taken my Social Security card out of my wallet, having kept it there since I received it updated with my married name in 1972. I guess I'm a pretty slow study! So –

In Matthew 10:16, Jesus says to his disciples, "See, I am sending you out like sheep into the midst of wolves; so be wise as serpents and innocent as doves."

These are words we need to take to heart, because in this day and age there are all too many wolves on our phone lines and in our emails eager to "fleece" the sheep – us! So here are some serpentine words of wisdom for all us doves:

[Then] Senior Warden Carl Watson...brought this warning from SoCal Edison to our attention: "That 'SoCal Edison' phone call may not be legitimate."

SoCal Edison says: **"For your security, never give out your personal information, such as your SCE account number, Social Security number, Tax ID, credit card information or PIN number."**

They go on to say, "We have recently experienced an increase in reports of caller ID spoofing, a practice in which special phone equipment falsifies information on your caller ID display. Calls may appear to be from SCE, when in reality the caller has no association with SCE and may try to sell you products, collect personal information or say your electric bill is past due when it's not.

"Common **red flag warnings** related to spoofed phone calls: (1) Calls were made multiple times per day. (2) Callers were asked about customer's usage, meter, or other personal information. (3) Customers were provided recommendations for purchasing alternative energy products.

**"Tips to help protect yourself from caller ID spoofing scammers:**

(1) SCE will not send solar representatives to your home, nor do we have solar companies contact anyone by phone. (2) SCE will never ask for credit card information, a prepaid card such as Green Dot or electric usage information over the phone. (3) Do not use a call back number provided until you confirm it is an SCE number listed on your bill or the Contact Us page on sce.com."

In addition to Carl's warning, I read an article online called "Don't Get Caught in These 15 Social Security Scams" (which at one point I thought I had been). Embedded within this article was a link to another, "5 Things You Should Never Keep in Your Wallet". [On my recent trip to New Mexico I was down to "2 for 5" versus last year's "3 for 5". Progress!]

Amy will NOT BE HAPPY if I try to cram everything I learned from these two articles into the column space that I have remaining...so what I'm going to do is tell us about our wallets and provide the internet links to both articles. [I've just tested both links for this reprint and they're still good.]

Cameron Huddleston, the author of the wallet article, writes that there are five things we should never keep in our wallets or purses. According to data from Travelers' Insurance, "more than 40% of identity fraud cases stem from a stolen or lost wallet or purse," leading to "situations that can open one up to Social Security fraud."

The five things we should never keep in our wallets or purses are: (1) Social Security card; (2) Birth certificate or passport; (3) Extra credit cards; (4) PINS and passwords; (5) Checkbooks full of blank checks. (I'm 3 for 5. That'll change!)

The Social Security article is longer and more detailed, so what I'm going to do here is just list some of the "no-no" situations. I'll also give you the really, really long link for the site at the end.

Be suspicious/cautious/don't do it, if you are asked for your SSN in these situations: (1) you receive a phone call supposedly initiated by the "IRS"; (2) an **incoming** caller asks for it; (3) you get a call about "jury duty" that you "missed" and there's now "a warrant out for your arrest"; (4) you're on a website that is unsecured, meaning that there's no green padlock or the word 'Secure' preceding the address of the website.

(5) The "Social Security Administration" emails you. According to this article, "The Social Security Administration will never email you requesting your Social Security number, date of birth, or other identifying information. Some scammers might even pose as the Social Security Administration and call you asking for similar information or asking you to go to a website to update your information, when in fact the website is a fake used by thieves to collect personal information."

(6) If you lose your wallet – and this one's the segue to the other article; (7) if you receive a phone call from an unverified Medicaid insurance caller; (8) if you receive a text message on your smartphone asking for this information, an action called "smishing"; and (9) if your need to make a copy of your Social Security number: "If you need to make a copy of your Social Security number, make sure you're not using a copier that is leased and will one day be resold. AARP warns that these machines are often bought by scammers who hope to find sensitive information, like your SSN, in the copier or scanner's hard drives. Stay safe and limit your copying and scanning to your personal devices."

### BOOK CLUB

The Book Club will be meeting on **Saturday June 9th** in the Library from 9:30am—11:00am. This month the group will review their current selection:

*Hillbilly Elegy* is a passionate and personal analysis of a culture in crisis—that of white working-class Americans. The decline of this group, a demographic of our country that has been slowly disintegrating over forty years, has been reported on with growing frequency and alarm, but has never before been written about as searingly from the inside. J. D. Vance tells the true story of what a social, regional, and class decline feels like when you were born with it hung around your neck.

The Vance family story begins hopefully in postwar America. J. D.'s grandparents were "dirt poor and in love," and moved north from Kentucky's Appalachia region to Ohio in the hopes of escaping the dreadful poverty around them. They raised a middle-class family, and eventually their grandchild (the author) would graduate from Yale Law School, a conventional marker of their success in achieving generational upward mobility.

But as the family saga of *Hillbilly Elegy* plays out, we learn that this is only the short, superficial version. Vance's grandparents, aunt, uncle, sister, and, most of all, his mother, struggled profoundly with the demands of their new middle-class life, and were never able to fully escape the legacy of abuse, alcoholism, poverty, and trauma so characteristic of their part of America. Vance piercingly shows how he himself still carries around the demons of their chaotic family history.

A deeply moving memoir with its share of humor and vividly colorful figures, *Hillbilly Elegy* is the story of how upward mobility really feels. And it is an urgent and troubling meditation on the loss of the American dream for a large segment of this country.

**HERITAGE PERSONAGES by W. Stewart Roberts**

**Chapter 2: An Unfinished Long Journey continued**

The Ninth Lambeth Conference was convened in Canterbury on July 3, 1958 with over 300 bishops from throughout the Anglican Communion attending. One was the Bishop of Birmingham, England, The Right Reverend John Leonard Wilson (November 23, 1897 – July 22, 1970). Leonard Wilson shocked most of the other bishops by proposing a resolution allowing the ordination of woman to the priesthood. It failed!

Earlier in 1922 Leonard Wilson received a B. A. in Theology from Queen’s College, Oxford. In 1930 he married Mary Phillips; they had a daughter and four sons. After serving as Dean of St. John’s Cathedral in Hong Kong, he was ordained as Bishop of Singapore in 1941. His family escaped to Australia in anticipation of the Japanese invasion. Leonard Wilson stayed in Singapore where he was imprisoned at Changai Interment Camp and nearly beaten to death by his Japanese captors. After the war, he became Dean of Manchester and Later Bishop of Birmingham from 1953 to 1969 when he retired. He died the next year.

Note: Leonard Wilson’s daughter, The Rev. Canon Susan Cole-King, delivered a homely on her father’s wartime experience and the need for peace at the Lambeth Conference, August 6, 1998.
