From our Rector

Who'd have thought?

Who'd have thought back at the beginning of Lent that by the middle of Lent we'd be sheltering at home, working from home, going to school at home?

Who'd have thought at the middle of Lent that we'd still be worshiping from home on the Feast of Pentecost?

Who'd have thought that we would head into the Season after Pentecost – that we would head into Ordinary Time – in a time that is anything but ordinary.

(In terms of the church, of course, "Ordinary Time" doesn't mean "ho hum", but rather indicates that in the Season after Pentecost, the Sundays are designated by ordinal numbers.) Even so, "ordinary" ain't what it used to be for any of us!

This has been a long, draining, stressful, tragic, sad, loss-filled, and confining road. It's presented us with spiritual, emotional, and economic challenges, cancelled celebrations and delayed life passages; and it's a road whose end is not yet in sight. We are still traveling in, and through, unknown territory; still making things up as we go along, adapting, adapting, adapting – but bad as that is, it's not necessarily all bad.

Change, and the ability to adapt to change, are signs of life, signs of resilience – and, I would say, are also signs of faith; faith in God and in God's presence with us now, and faith in God's good future and purposes.

With this in mind, I commend to each of us the Collect for Grace, found on page 100 in the Prayer Book:

"Lord God, almighty and everlasting Father, you have brought us in safety to this new day: Preserve us with your mighty power, that we may not fall into sin, nor be overcome by adversity; and in all we do, direct us to the fulfilling of your purpose; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen."

This prayer reminds us that God's future is actually now, that God's purposes are being fulfilled now, through us: through our actions and our decisions; through our words and our deeds. And, as has been emphasized repeatedly by Presiding Bishop Michael Curry, by Bishop John Taylor, and by so many others, God's purposes are being fulfilled now when we love our neighbors in the same way and to the same extent as we love ourselves.

In the short term, loving others means keeping them safe through our own actions. It means protecting them with our own deeds so that they too may overcome adversity, rather than be overcome by it.

To this end of love, this coming Tuesday the Diocese plans to release its own guidelines as to the preparations that congregations need to make and the protocols they need to put into place before opening the doors of their buildings to in-person worship once again. Formulated in accordance with the CDC and the State of California, the guidelines are pretty extensive, and I commend Senior Warden Donna Watson and the Trinity Reopening Committee for their willingness to take on this monumental task.

As of this writing, Bishop Taylor is looking towards the weekend of June 20th and 21st as being the EARLIEST that a congregation COULD return to VERY LIMITED in-person worship.

However, I can't emphasize strongly enough that NO congregation MUST return to in-person worship then, or any time before they feel they are prepared to do so safely. The designated weekend is a doorway, not a deadline – and I would much prefer that we at Trinity resume in-person worship safely and carefully rather than quickly!


As I said in my sermon last Sunday, the time **will** come when we will move forward, out of the era of COVID-19. What will we want to take with us from this time? What values have we rediscovered? What wisdom have we gained?

The post-COVID-19 future we come to will not be the pre-COVID-19 past we left behind.

But God is, and will, still be there.

Instructions to participate in Zoom

1. You will need a computer, tablet, or smartphone with a built-in camera and speakers/headphone.
2. It works best if you “register” at Zoom before our Sunday worship so the application can be downloaded onto your device. For a computer or tablet, please go to Zoom.us and follow the prompts to install. Please select “yes” to all prompts.
3. If using a smart phone please download the free app from the app store on your phone. Again, please select “yes” to all prompts and provide the information requested.
4. On Saturday late afternoon, Trinity will send an invitation to join our Sunday Zoom teleconference Morning Prayer. On Sunday morning before 9am please click on the invitation link to “Join via computer” which will take you directly to our session. There will also be a phone number provided for the phone call option. If you did not previously load the Zoom application, you can join our meeting by going to “join.zoom.us” and typing in the 9-digit Meeting ID provided in the Trinity invitation.

To Join...Just before the Meeting Time:

To join with a computer or tablet click on the link in the invitation. This will take you directly to our Zoom session. You will be asked to “Join with computer AUDIO” select “yes”. You will be asked to “Join with computer Video” select “yes”.

To join with a smart phone, open the app and use the small “gear” icon (top left) to access and bypass signing on (registering) again. Please enter the phone number provided in your emailed invitation.

Once you have joined:

All will enter the Zoom meeting by being placed in a “waiting room”. Rev. Annie will let you in and greet you. Before our worship begins all will be ‘unmuted’. Once we start all will be “muted”. Please stay muted during our worship because when we all talk it’s too confusing.

To hear use “Mute/Unmute” which is the microphone icon on the bottom left of the Zoom screen

To see each other use the “Start/Stop Video” icon (also on the bottom left of the Zoom screen) that looks like a video camera. This will close off your camera and we will not be able to see you...so please don’t we want to see each other!

As more people join us the live picture of all participants will get smaller and may be presented over a few pages. To see these please select the “gallery view” icon off the top right of your screen. The icon looks like nine small squares in a block shape.

There are more controls and options within this platform. These are the basic ones you will need. When our session is over please you will see an orange box near the bottom right of the page: “Leave Session”. Please select that and it will shut down the platform.
