From our Rector

One of the most popular programs that has taken place at Trinity in recent years has been our youth Confirmation program, “Confirm not Conform” – also known as CnC. Since 2009, a total of twenty-five Trinity young people have participated in CnC: ten in 2009-2010, ten in 2012-2013, and five in 2016-2017.

Originally put together by an Episcopal Church in Oakland, the primary goal of CnC, as may be gathered from its name, is to encourage young people not simply to “conform” to the beliefs of others, but through the process of the curriculum, to wrestle with and to “confirm” their own Christian beliefs. CnC features interactive classroom work, creative homework assignments, field trips to other houses of worship, and mentor relationships with adults in the congregation who aren’t members of the students’ own families.

There’s been remarkable level of “staying power” in CnC, with lasting relationships formed between the students themselves, as well as between many students and their mentors.

Has everyone who’s come through CnC at Trinity gone on to be confirmed? No, although most have – which means the program works, because it can help a young person recognize and confirm that they might need more time before being confirmed.

As the Prayer Book puts it, “In the course of their Christian development, those baptized at an early age are expected, when they are ready and have been duly prepared, to make a mature public affirmation of their faith and commitment to the responsibilities of their Baptism and to receive the laying on of hands by the bishop.” (BCP 412)

CnC helps a young person decided if he or she is ready to make that “mature public affirmation.”

So why am I going into all this? Because we’re about to launch in-person CnC 2021!!!

So far, our 2021 participants are Declan Anderson, Simone Bilodeau, Austin Carey, Dubem Elendu, Uzo Elendu, Arianna Jaime, Kevin Patterson, and Emma Sosa.


Granted, as with so many things these days, this year’s program is going to be a little different. Bishop John Taylor is going to be with us for his official visitation and the administration of Confirmation on Sunday, July 4, so our classes will be finishing the week before.

Running for one Wednesday evening (May 12) and the next seven Sunday afternoons, we’re going to compress the curriculum to have eight classes instead of 16, and we won’t be able to go on field trips at this point, but the good news is that mentor relationships and “faith exploration and wrestling” will be alive and well!

Congregations are involved in CnC too. One of the first things a CnC student does is to sign a commitment pledge together with a representative of the congregation. Each pledges to take the program seriously, and the congregation promises to honor the students’ questions and to support them in prayer – and you may remember that in the past, our CnC students and their mentors have been included in the Prayers of the People each week for the duration of the course. Come May 16, these prayers will be back!

CnC is invigorating for all of us – and I’m thrilled that it’s part of our life again.

Please join me in congratulating our new class, and lifting them up in prayer!
