Have you turned in your Parish Survey?

Thank you so much if you have....and good for you.

Some of us may still have them sitting on a table at home. Some of us don't quite remember where we put them. Some of us may just think that 115 questions is way too long. Don't worry or be intimidated. It really won't take much time for you to complete and there are extra survey's on the back table of the church if you need a new one.

You may also be thinking why are these survey's so important. Things are going great right now. Right?

The quick answer is that the Church Canons state that before a new rector can be called to our parish, our congregation must complete a parish profile. No matter who we decide to call.

The longer and more important answer is that the only way our parish can go forward is to find out where we came from, who we are now, and what we value going forward. The last time we went through this exercise was more than fifteen (15) years ago. We are not the same parish and understandably so. We have grown in our spiritual life. We have added new members. #### NOTICE FROM THE TRINITY NURSES

Trinity's AEDs or Automatic External Defibrillators

As some of you may know your Faith Community Nurses hold our CPR/AED certification class for the ushers and office staff every two years (check out the pics below). After our last class it became evident that not everyone knew we had Two (2) AED's and where they were located. The use of this device is critical to saving lives in the event of a sudden cardiac arrest. Everyone at Trinity needs to know the location of these devices. One is located in the office on the wall leading directly into Rev Annie's old office, and the second one is in the Parish Hall's large kitchen on the wall as you go directly through the kitchen door. Each is colored bright red and is secured on the wall but is easily removed by sliding it out of its bracket. Any of your nurses will gladly show you where the devices are located and answer any questions you may have. In our class we are instructed to use three commands if we encounter an apparent cardiac emergency, "You call 911, you get the AED, and come right back."

We all can be members of a life-saving team. Let's all do our part to be prepared.


Thanksgiving Dinner in a Basket...or in this case a box!

### November featured book: Three Sisters by Heather Morris

Against all odds, three Slovakian sisters have survived years of imprisonment in the most notorious death camp in Nazi Germany: Auschwitz. Livia, Magda, and Cibi have clung together, nearly died from starvation and overwork, and the brutal whims of the guards in this place of horror. But now, the allies are closing in and the sisters have one last hurdle to face: the death march from Auschwitz, as the Nazis try to erase any evidence of the prisoners held there. Due to a last minute stroke of luck, the three of them are able to escape formation and hide in the woods for days before being rescued.

And this is where the story begins. From there, the three sisters travel to Israel, to their new home, but the battle for freedom takes on new forms. Livia, Magda, and Cibi must face the ghosts of their past--and some secrets that they have kept from each other--to
